MESSAGE FROM TOWN BOARD CHAIR, CORY BEHRENDT

Life on the "Edge"

Over the last year there has been a lot of discussion on planning, development and managing the many pressures that are coming from many different directions. This is understandable as the seven-county metropolitan area is on course to add one million new people between 2000 and 2030. Of that growth, two-thirds will occur outside of the central cities and inner-ring suburbs. That means suburbs and "edge", rural communities, such as Eureka Township.

We have begun to see the early stages of growth, such as the increase of utilities (interceptor line, crude oil pipeline, natural gas line, proposed transmission line), watershed management ordinances, proposed airport expansion, neighboring communities' development, and proposed annexation.

Along with typical growth pressures, often comes a change in resident attitude. New residents look at property as an investment and can resist change; versus long term resident's who have seen growth for a long time and may embrace growth as opportunity to sell and retire.

The following are things the township must be prepared to deal with as growth continues to emerge:

- * community identity and negotiating growth vs. anti-growth forces
- * providing adequate leadership to handle growth
- * increase in revenue to support infrastructure, planning and legal assistance
- * creating partnerships with other communities
- * preserving natural resources

One thing is for certain, the residents of the township are the bread and butter of what makes a "town". In reading through the news letter you will find many ways that show how the township continues to build its identity. This includes recognizing and preserving our history, strategic planning process, and working with several issues that will impact residents now and in the future.

TOWNSHIP ROADS Supervisor Contact Dan Rogers

- •In addition to maintenance grading, we are working on getting trees removed that interfer with road right-of-ways.
 - •Overlay on roads in Eureka Estates is completed.
- •We are working with DNR on the parking lot entrance at the south end of Chub Lake to smooth the entry to the wildlife area.
- •Black topping of the Town Hall parking lot has been completed, as recommended by the citizens at the annual meeting last March. The money came out of the general fund.

TOWN BOARD ISSUES

Air Lake and Metropolitan Airport Commission: Representatives held an open house at Eureka Town Hall Sep. 26 to discuss the proposed changes to the Air Lake Airport. These changes include an increase of hangars over the next several years on the south side of the current runway, and runway extensions to the east (one includes the curving of Cedar Ave. to the east to accommodate the safety zone). MAC plans to brief the Township on a regular basis, with final decision on options to come in November. Any noise or complaints should be directed to 612-726-9411 with as much information as possible. See page 3 for details.

Watershed/Wetlands Septic Inspections: Similar to the septic inspection on properties in the Chub Lake and Chub Creek area late summer, the Vermillion Watershed Planning Commission is planning their "Septic Compliance Effort." This will involve on-site inspections of septic systems along the main branch of the Vermillion (and eventually along tributaries as well) to identify systems that pre-date the County's 1996 septic system standards update for compliance. Citizens in these areas will be required to update systems that are not in compliance. For more information, e-mail vrwjpo@co.dakota.mn.us.

Complaints: Every so often complaints are brought to the Town Board about activity that does not follow Ordinances. These complaints must come to the Town Board in writing and signed by that person. Names are held confidential by data and privacy act. (No phone calls or anonymous notes can be accepted.) Specific issues are discussed by Township Supervisors with those involved to resolve the complaint, and may be followed with letters, inspections, and warnings. Eventually legal action is taken if not resolved in a fair and timely manner.

Escrow Funds: When requesting an item from the Township which requires an escrow account by ordinance (such as Conditional Use and Variances, etc.), a \$500 escrow deposit must be received with the request to be considered complete in addition to a \$250 (non-refundable) application fee. Escrow funds are used to pay for required attorney action, professional services, etc; and unused portions will be returned to the applicant. The applicant is responsible for all fees, including additional escrow funds as required. For more complex requests, additional escrow amounts may be required upon consideration of the Board.

Townhall: Dakota City was not able to obtain enough funds to move the old Townhall to the fair grounds, so the Board has extended offers to those who have bid on it. To date we have not worked out any deal to have it moved. It is on the 10/10 agenda for follow-up.

Trees and Obstructions in the Right-of-Way: The township has identified on its annual road review several areas in the Township that trees and other obstructions cause safety issues in the right-of-way. The Township is working with individual property owners to document the identified obstructions and have them removed.

DID YOU KNOW ABOUT EUREKA ORDINANCE

This is a quick ordinance synopsis; for complete information, refer to Eureka Township Ordinances. They are available from the Town Clerk at \$25 for hard copy, \$2 for CD disk, or can be accessed on our website, or at Farmington or Lakeville Libraries, or Eureka Town Hall, or the County Law Library.

A reminder that the following Ordinances have been detailed in previous newsletters. Ordinances on Signs, Firearms, Snow plowing & obstructions, ATVs, Junk Vehicles are written to guide actions, treat all citizens fairly, and eliminate disputes between neighbors. Permitting of swimming pools, decks, septic systems, home additions, & out buildings protects current owners, as well as future owners, by enforcing local and state standards and building codes. It has been reported that several of these items have been built without permits; please contact our Clerk if you have made improvements that have not been registered. A reminder: Fees are doubled when such things are built without permit.

EUREKA HISTORY PROJECT:

This is a citizen led effort to recognize all the people who have dedicated their time to the Township since 1858 to date to make our community a great place to live and work. Lorraine and Ray Swedeen, Georgie Molitor, Nancy Sauber and Mike Greco have sifted through microfiche and news records at the Mn. Historical Society, Dakota Historical Soc iety, Library records and Eureka records, etc. to find accurate names, offices, and dates. Despite this intense effort, there are still some missing records. Perhaps you may have the answers. See the reverse side of the business ads insert and check out the names. EUREKA PLANNING COMMISSION MESSAGE

New Procedure for Obtaining Deck, Pool, and Septic System Permits

In an effort to simplify the process for obtaining permits for decks, swimming pools, and septic systems, the township has adopted a new policy for applying for these permits:

1. The town clerk and planning commission chair (or vice chair) will jointly review applications for deck, pool, and septic system permits as soon as they are received. Incomplete applications will be returned within 15 days, and must be resubmitted.

2. If the clerk and planning commissioner agree the proposal meets township ordinances, the clerk will approve the permit; applicants need not appear before the planning commission or town board. The clerk will forward building plans and/or septic plans to the township building inspector, who will issue a permit per his usual procedure. Once a permit has been issued, applicants can obtain their permit from the town clerk after paying the appropriate permit fees. No work can begin on the project until the applicant has paid for and obtained the proper permits.

3. In those cases where the clerk and the planning commissioner do not agree that the proposal meets township ordinance requirements, then the application will be forwarded to the planning commission for review per the township's standard procedures for reviewing permits; in such cases, the applicant must appear before the planning commission and town board. No work can begin on the

project until the proper permits have been obtained.

STRATEGIC VISIONING CITIZEN ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT by Sharon Buckley

The process of planning for our future is well underway! In August, the Planning Commission interviewed applicants for the strategic visioning Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC). There were 24 excellent candidates who applied to be a part of this work group, from which the following 15 were chosen: Jody Arman-Jones, Kathy Blair, Atina Diffley, Denise Griffith, Carrie Jennings, Ray Kaufenberg, Ed Korba, Janet Novak, Jeff Otto, Jim Sauber, Glen Shirley, John Storlie, Pete Storlie, Ray Swedeen, and Bernie Wood. Also serving on this committee are Planning Commissioners Sharon Buckley and Rich Stevens.

The initial kick-off meeting was held on September 19 at the Town Hall, with facilitation by Bill Weber of McCombs Frank Roos Associates. Bill is the planning consultant hired by the township to guide us through the process of creating a vision for the future of Eureka Township. This will be about a year-long process, consisting of CAC meetings, a citizen opinion survey, public forums and open houses. Watch for the Citizens Opinion Survey to be mailed in November.

Future meetings are tentatively scheduled on October 17, November 14, January 23 (town forum), and February 20. All meetings are held from 7-9 PM at the town hall, and are open to the public for observation. Watch the Eureka Township web site to confirm meeting dates, read minutes of past minutes, and to provide your input through a feedback form.
