Comprehensive Plan. Find out more!

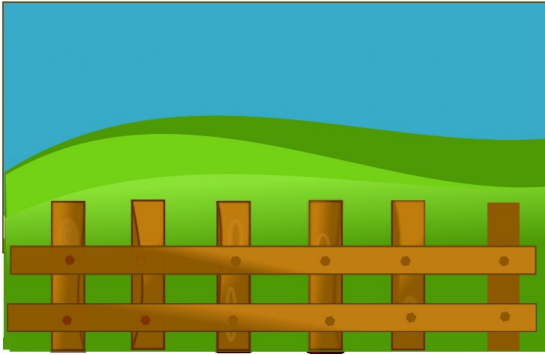
At least once every 10 years, city councils, town boards, and county
boards throughout the region update their local comprehensive plans. A
local comprehensive plan represents a community's vision of how it wants
to grow and change – how it will develop its land, redevelop older areas,
ensure adequate housing, provide roads and sewers, protect natural areas,
and meet other community objectives.

Under State law, the Metropolitan Council reviews local comprehensive
plans to ensure they're in accord with the overall framework provided by
the regional plans. The review helps determine how a community's
planned actions relate to the interests of the whole region over the long
term. It helps ensure that costly public infrastructure, like roads and
sewers, are built in an economical and coordinated fashion, so that user
fees and tax dollars are spent wisely.

Township Updates

Airlake Airport Possible Annexation – The Town Board has tasked the Planning Commission with examining the different options open to the Township. Among the options to be explored are a Joint Powers Agreement, incorporation, and orderly annexation. The Commission will be assisted by attorney Chad Lemmons and TKDA Senior Planner Sherri Buss. The process is scheduled to begin in November and has a six-month time period.

“Granny Pods” - The Minnesota Legislature passed a law last session permitting the housing, commonly known as “granny pods,” but also allowing communities the ability to opt out of allowing them. The portable housing is similar to a tiny house or recreational vehicle, intended for short term habitability. At its September 2016 meeting, the Town Board voted to opt out, or not to change ordinances to allow them.
