### Addendum A

Nancy Sauber, 9445 225th St. W., Lakeville

I have a few comments about the Commercial/Industrial (C/I) "work group."

- 1. By Ordinance, since this group was appointed by the Board, this should be a Special Committee of 5 people, minimum.
- 2. As such, it is subject to the Open Meeting Law. Contrary to that, there have been no recordings of the meetings per Township policy. There are no posted agendas or minutes on the website. Not all currently scheduled meetings are even on the website. A meeting was held last night on a federal holiday, which is not allowed. Even more important, there have been *no public copies of documents* being discussed. These have not been "open meetings."
- 3. How much money has been spent by this group? Was it all preapproved by the Board?
- 4. It is quite something to listen to comments such as: [Should this C/I area] be on the section lines? Maybe the quarter-quarter lines? Let's go up to the railroad. Should it go to 235th or all the way to 250th? Do you ever envision a C/I area around Town Hall? *Based on what?* A planner is sorely needed.
- 5. There has been mention of setbacks, but not of performance standards generally. Anything goes?
- 6. There HAS been mention of new roads, curb and gutter, sewer and water, water towers, uses ranging from sexually oriented businesses to fast food restaurants and so on. Where is the <u>factual basis</u> for these discussions? To blindly act on the "Everybody knows that such-and-such is going to happen" rule is irresponsible.
- 7. "Market forces" have been mentioned several times. Instead of listening to amateur and largely uninformed opinion, the market study from the earlier C/I Task Force should be updated. That would be responsible leadership.
- 8. Do we have realistic idea of the costs and benefits to the Township? As outlined in the earlier C/I Task Force document, a fiscal impact study should be conducted to get a clearer picture of this. That would be responsible leadership.
- 9. It is premature to hold an Open House at this time, not to mention it would be during the holidays. If the Board intends to go through with this, professional guidance should first be sought. With zoning authority comes certain responsibilities to all the citizens of Eureka.

Public Comment - Georgie Molitor - 8875 225th St. W.

Questions about Commercial/Industrial Zoning

- 1. Will heavy commercial and industrial prevent building a house, adding a barn or adding onto our house?
- 2. Will light commercial/home business do the same? I would rather see this type on my land. These businesses do not create big issues and probably would like to stay as Eureka.
- 3. Will the lights be as intense as Uponor and Fed Ex, thus interfering with any existing homes?
- 4. Has the Board asked other land owners if they want industrial? I have no problem with home business which does not bother anyone, but not industrial/heavy commercial.
- 5. If this zoning idea was started to prevent annexing to Lakeville, then would it not be more likely that heavy commercial/Industrial will ask to be annexed to Lakeville rather than a home business?
- 6. Can I transfer my zoning rights to another property that wants this?
- 7. Who requested this? Developers who own property or citizens? Was it Miracle Grow and Buestrom? This will expand their business without community benefit but only benefit a big business.

Addendum C

I would like to express concern over, what I see, as the mishandling of the commercial development project. The majority of the planning commission had no opportunity to participate or provide input. Meetings were happening before most of the planning commission knew a team had formed. Eventually, I was allowed to listen to a meeting. None of the documents were made available for viewing.

To be clear, I am not against commercial development. I believe it is necessary to insure financial viability of this township. But, *how* we do it will have an impact that will last for decades. We don't want to mess this up because a small group is in a hurry to profit off the change.

What I saw at the meeting I did attend; was 2 supervisors and 2 commissioners working out minor policy details. "How high should a roof top fence be to hide HVAC?" Seemed like modifications to an existing document. An audience sitting in silence, not allowed to speak.

This violates everything I ever learned about project planning, public or private. I don't see that the fundamental question of "IF" we should zone for commercial development has been answered. Yet copious details of "HOW" we will do it are being put to paper. My suspicion is that a single, detailed plan will be floated at a public hearing.

Ten years ago this issue was handled in a much different manner. Input from citizens was actively solicited along with assistance by professional planners. In the end it was decided to continue as an exclusively agricultural township. De we know that the majority of the community have changed their minds? Perhaps a referendum in March would answer that question.

I suggest that the board could better serve the community by quantifying the benefits and liabilities of commercial development. Add multiple possible options. Let that start a dialog with the citizens.
