

Eureka Township
Board Meeting
October 1980

The board met at the town hall.

All members present.

Minutes of September meeting and treasurer report were accepted as read.

Bills were presented. Tribune \$6.34, Macklin \$37.80, Primary election \$126.00, Rother \$2,178.01, 225th St Road \$19,000.00, Engineer \$4,000.00. Zweber made a motion to pay 225th road bill of \$19,000 by warrant. Johnson made a motion to amend by paying \$15,000 by warrant at this time, seconded by Sauber, all approved.

Johnson made a motion to pay Engineer Dwirsified \$2,000.00, seconded by Kadlec, passed 5-0.

Johnson then made a motion to pay all the rest of the bills. Seconded by Sauber, passed 5-0.

Robert Dawson's were not present when called.

Mr. Frank Beissel asked for a permit for a storage shed. Zweber motion, seconded by Johnson, carried.

Tom Conroy's request for a silo permit was passed on a motion Johnson, seconded by Kadlec.

Steve and Mary Nusser complained about a home they bought in Eureka Estates. They questioned as to the permit and said it had never been inspected by our inspector, also that the basement leaks. Johnson made a motion to have our lawyer obtain a court order to check on buildings, this firm have built in Eureka Estates, seconded by Kadlec and passed.

Smith reported that the road on 225th St. was almost complete. A bend at Johnson's driveway was objected by Johnson Brothers but o.k.ed by the County.

Sauber made a motion to hire a different lawyer in the 247th St bridge damage case as Macklin represents G & T Trucking. Zweber seconded the motion carried.

Dag Kernel owners Dakken and Barr appeared next as some complaints about noise. Since no neighbors appeared to complain Johnson suggested no action be taken.

Mr. Quanbeck and lawyers Getts came forward to present a plan to divide the Quanbeck property on Chub Lake. The board was not in favor of any action. Mr. Getts then presented some alternatives. Smith suggested that our lawyer contact their lawyer or wait to see what their next move would be in this case.

George Sauber reported on the solid waste meeting. He asked the board to check up on the ordinance to see if we can prohibit such dumps. He also reported that the M.A.C. plan would only result in a 1 or 2 % loss in taxes in their takeover of Airlake.
