

## EUREKA TOWN BOARD MEETING OCT. 10, 1988

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by Chairperson Schindledecker. Present were Supervisors Curry, Larson and Lee, Clerk Leine and Treasure Schulz.

Clerk Leine read the minutes of Sept. Board meeting. Curry moved to except minutes as read, Seconded by Larson and carried.

Lee moved to except treasures report as read, Seconded by Curry and carried.

Clerk Leine presented bills totaling \$6198.62. Bills included Minnesota Associated Insurance, election judges, and building insurance of \$49.50 and not \$275.00 as figured. Larson moved to pay all bills, Seconded by Curry and carried.

Clerk Leine reported on the primary election. The township has 630 eligible voters. 61 voted of which 5 were incorrectly marked and could not be counted.

Public hearing on Animal Nuisance Ordinance got under way by reading legal opinion from Attorney Macklin.

Is the town board willing to assume responsibility for enforcement?

How much money will the township be willing to spend for contract services of a "catcher" the sheriff can use?

How do you pay for this service?

Sheriff's Dept. customary does not enforce State Statutes thereby offering an offended party access to the courts to seek restitution. Majority public at meeting feels something should be done to control animals. Several in attendants want a township ordinance. Others feel that the State already has enough laws on the books and that the Sheriff's Dept. should enforce these laws. Curry made a motion to hold a special meeting on Oct. 18, 1988, at 8 P.M. to hear and debate the Nuisance topic. This motion was seconded by Lee and carried.

Bob Boyer of TKDA and Jim Fortman of MAC came before board asking for a permit to extend water from the City of Lakeville into Eureka. Purpose of water line is to furnish air craft hanger area with fire protection. Connection to Lakeville water would be at Hamburg Ave and reconnect at 220th St. A total of four hydrants would be installed on this line. MAC would pay for installation of the line & hydrants. After installation MAC would transfer owner ship and maintenance over to the City of Lakeville MAC would lead us to believe that Lakeville, Fire Marshal James

Mitchel requested this action. Lakeville has stated that MAC has a problem at Airlake. They did not offer any solution. MAC contends that Lakeville raised this question and would be willing to solve problem with City water. Eureka has never been contacted about alleged problem. Eureka said that maybe MAC should dig a well and furnish their own water like everyone else in the township. Board pointed out that Lakeville Fire Dept. does have a contract with Eureka for fire protection. This protection does include Airlake for which MAC pays nothing. Board also pointed out the fact that the MET Council has stated that no sewage or water is to come into Eureka before the year 2000. To make a change the comprehensive plan would have to be reworked and then accepted by the Council. Citizens on hand for the meeting feel the air port should get no special treatment. Copies of James Michell and James Robinette letter's attached to minutes. Curry moved to get explanation of Michell letter and talk to Lakeville Fire Dept. about requirements at airlake, Seconded by Larson and carried.

Pat Harvey, representing himself, feels that Lakeville has no authority and will not connect water to Airlake without an agreement worked out with Eureka township.

Ralph Fredlund, 23680 Jersey Ct, and other home owners have gotten their lots replated. Curry moved to except the replat, Seconded by Lee and carried.

Eureka township will join other townships in Dakota County for recycling program, once we find out what their plan is going to be.

Residents on 235th came before the board asking something be done to their street. Mr. Howser said that the grader had been past 3 times within the week and all wash boards are still in place. Miller Const. stated that road was bad. Dry weather doesn't make matters any better. Residents said that the road has gotten worse each year. Miller Const. stated reason for the deterioration of this road.

Board took millers suggestion of looking at red rock to help rebuild road.

Charles Hanson, Highview, requested a building permit for a 30 x 50 pole barn with slap floor. A \$15.00 permit fee charged. Curry moved to grant permit, Seconded by Lee and carried.

TC Construction, 6202-240th St. W., Elko, made change in building location from Lot 6, Block 7 when Country rejected building because of flood plain, to Lot 2, Block 8. TC Const. is asking

for a permit for 3 more houses. He has not been before planning commission. TC Const. has asked for a special meeting of the planning commission for 7 PM. Oct. 18, 1988. to act upon submitted plans. A special Townboard meeting will then be held to review commissions finding and act upon and requested permits. No permits will be granted until McDonald gets shoulders, on the roads into the second addition finished.

Township must check all signs again. County has incorrectly placed and must replaced.

Curry has made an inspection of Setkman garage and reported it in all right for placement into Eureka township.
