March 8, 1983 Town Meeting

Polls were closed at 8:00 pm and meeting called to order.

Richard Lee was chosen moderator.

Minutes of the 1982 meeting were approved as read.

Wayne Shaff told the meeting that our funds are placed in an interest bearing fund.

The treasurer report was presented on forms prepared by the clerk and accepted as read.

We were waiting for a senior citizen representative to show; since no one came it was shelved till later on in the meeting.

Return of the county roads 17-84-TH A was discussed. Motion by Lee Topp seconded by Yetzer to oppose the return unless they were blacktop. To present a petition signed by local residents to the County Board was approved.

Budget for 1984 was presented by Gary S. Gravel crushing and gravel pits were talked over, motion by Jerry Swanson, seconded by Yetzer to allow the board to use their own discretion. Passed on a voice vote.

The clerk brought up revenue sharing funds disposition. On a motion by Yetzer, seconded by Jerry Swanson to allow the board to use the funds as the saw fit there was no discussion so it passed on a voice vote.

The senior citizen request for a donation was again brought up by Gary. John Strunk pointed out that Lakeville would also ask for a donation if they started a senior center. On a motion by Yetzer seconded by Jerry Swanson it was decided to give the same as last year..

Mosquito control was discussed but no action taken.

Since we did not know the amount of State aid we would receive in 1984, Gary suggested we would hold over 1983 town meeting open until September 27 at which time we would know what the action was taken by the state. Ay suggested an ad in the paper to let people know of this meeting.

Second meeting September 12, 1983

Since we knew at this time the amount of State aid we would recerive the amount of our 1984 levy was brought up and discussed on a motion by Dale Leine for \$92,000.00 seconded by Larry Bixby this amount was passed with no dissenting votes.
