

## CONTINUATION OF TOWN BOARD MEETING MAY 14, 1984

Will Storlie, Box 204, Farmington requested a permit to build a 32' x 64' pole barn with painted steel siding. Building would be located on Highview adjacent to new home under construction for Marietta Storlie. Supervisor Larson moved that a permit be granted; second L. Topp; Unanimous.

Westley L. Best, 8999 -267th St. W, requested a permit to build a 12' x 14': screen porch, attached to present home. Supervisor Topp moved that the permit be granted; second by Supervisor Larson; unanimous.

Mr. Robert Wood, Lundeen Construction Co., requested renewal of their Conditional Use Gravel Permit at a pit on 235th Street, west of Dodd road. After discussion, Supervisor Larson made a motion to renew the permit; second by Supervisor Lees unanimous.

Chm. Kadlec stated that Eureka Twp. is now included in the Northern Cannon River Watershed. Supervisor Schindeldecker moved to accept this action; second Supervisor Lee; unanimous.

Mrs. Eugene (Rose) Day, spokesperson for a group of about 15 neighbors in the area of 267th St. & Ipava Ave., presented the Board with several complaints against Joe Simon, who operates a horse brokerage/feedlot operation at 9724 -267th St. without a Conditional Use Permit. The complaints stated his fences were in poor repair and animals were constantly out of his control and were regularly found on neighboring property, and his feedlot practices regarding animal waste handling were of an offensive and unsanitary nature, possibly in violation of PCA standards. The Town Board stated that they would call the County Attorney and also the Dakota County Planning Dept. to see what action could be taken. (Notes Chmn Kadlec contacted the County Attorneys office and was told to instruct the Twp Atty to contact Mr. Simon, by letter and outline the Board's desire to have him comply with the Ordinances or legal action could be undertaken. This was the same information Vice Chm Schindeldecker received from John Forrest. As a result, Chm Kadlec instructed Vice Chm Schindeldecker to contact Mr. Macklin and have him write a letter to Mr. Simon outlining this position, and also to send a copy to Rose Day)

Mr. Naeem Qureshi, P.E. of Progressive Consulting Engineers, Inc. made a presentation to the Board on the costs and procedure of repairing bridges that were on a deficient bridge list compiled by the State of Minnesota. Supervisor Lee moved that the Bo3rd further discuss the bridge repair program, and that Chmn Kadlec would contact Mr. Qureshi at a later date regarding the board decisions.; second Supervisor Topp; unanimous.

Chmn Kadlec reported to the Board that he and Vice Chmn Schindeldecker had met with Township Attorney Bill Macklin and had discussed the MAC development plans and the Township's position regarding building permits for aircraft storage buildings. Chmn

Kadlec read a letter dated May 3, 1984, outlining the Board's position in this matter.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:45 PM.
