There are approximately 1,776 townships in Minnesota who will host their annual meetings on Tuesday, March 11.

Known as Township Day, these annual meetings happen every year on the second Tuesday in March and sets townships apart from other forms of local government. Many of the state's townships also have their township officer elections on Township Day. This is true for Eureka Township, so make sure you come and VOTE!

Important Happenings for Township Day 2025 At the Town Hall

 Township Officers Elections- Seat 5 Town Board Supervisor Polls open at 7:00 am and close at 8:00pm

The Town Hall will be closed for regular business during the election.

• Annual Meeting start time is approximately 8:15pm. Early arrival is not permitted. Polls must first be closed.

Minnesota State Law does not permit town meetings to be held remotely. Making motions and voting is limited to town citizens who are qualified to vote in a National Elections and who are present in the Town Hall at the time the vote is taken.

Private Wells

Dakota County received a \$100,000 grant from the Minnesota Department of Health to provide no-cost water testing and financial assistance to well users with water quality issues.

The grant is available for eligible landowners using a private well as their primary drinking source.

Applicants must meet certain income criteria and have well water exceeding state guidelines for arsenic, manganese, nitrate, coliform bacteria or lead.

Septic Systems

Septic tanks need to be pumped at least once every three years to remove excess accumulation of sludge, grease and scum.

Two Tips to help your system:

- Conserve water: Use water-efficient appliances, fix leaks, and spread-out water use throughout the day.
- Avoid harsh chemicals: Minimize use of bleach, detergents, soaps, and disinfectants.
